## Introduction

This document includes information on the objectives of the examination, a summary of its content, and the legislation and standards to be studied.

## Examination objectives and presentation

Successful candidates may act as guarantors for construction work included in the following subclass:

### **Construction site safety management**

### **Exam information**

- Duration: 1.5 hours
- Passing grade: 60%
- Language: French or English
- Type of exam: multiple-choice questions

### **Examination content**

The examination for the “Construction site safety management” subclass covers the following modules:

- Prevention management;
- Management of compensation claim files;
- Assessment management;
- Statutes and regulations;
- Sustainable development.

To meet the requirements of “Construction site safety management” it is necessary to:

- Know the statutes and regulations governing prevention and site inspection;
- Know the CNESST and its various rules and procedures;
- Know the role of different stakeholders in health and safety;
- Know the rights and responsibilities of workers and employers;
- Define the boundaries of the construction site and monitor it;
- Investigate incidents and be able to identify risks;
- Integrate sustainable development concepts.

## Exam preparation

To prepare for the exam, it is advisable to review the competency profile, which describes all the competencies and skills required of the guarantor that could be evaluated during the exam.
